President's Welcome

Every day, staff and volunteers at United Ways are hard at work in communities across Canada. Locally and nationally, our goal is the same: to create opportunities for a better life for everyone in our communities. This year, Central New Brunswick demonstrated deep generosity and a commitment to improve the quality of life for our residents, strengthening our community. Individuals and companies contributed nearly \$1.3 million to our annual campaign.

Our mission captures the essence of what we do: We improve lives and build community by engaging individuals and mobilizing collective action. Thanks to our generous donors, the United Way can continue delivering on this mission, helping the 1-in-4 people in our community who rely on the invaluable work of United Way agencies.

This continues to be an exciting time for our United Way. We have endorsed the Housing First model through the Canadian Alliance to End Homelessness and we continue a leadership role with the Community Action Group on Homelessness. We are ensuring food security through Community Food Smart, and engaging new community members and businesses in United Way's impact work through opportunities like Day of Caring and Feels Good Folly Fest.

United Way recognizes the vital importance of engaging the youth. To that end we coordinate "Be a Leader-Be a Hero" which empowers elementary school children to make a difference in the lives of others through good deeds. Similarly our "Student Impact Committee", which allows high school students to make lasting and measurable change in their community, aims to increase the engagement of young adults in the United Way and to provide opportunities for leadership development. Both programs ensure the stewards of tomorrow are being developed today.

Over the past year the Board of Directors has been busy completing

governance and committee work. The *Strategic Planning* committee completed consultations with United Way member agencies and Continued work throughout the year to lay the foundation for the years ahead. The *Communications* committee developed a plan which will raise the profile of the United Way within Central New Brunswick as a community impact organization. The *Human Resources* committee updated the Personnel Policy Manual and their terms of reference. *Admissions and Allocations* received and reviewed more than 80 applications totaling more than \$1M in requests and allocated almost \$600K from the Community Fund.

This year our *Community Investment* committee is tasked with maximizing the impact of our donors' donations and ensuring they align with the biggest issues we are facing in our community. All the while we are committed to ensuring these investments are transparent to our agencies and donors.

I would like to thank our Board of Directors, volunteers, community partners, businesses, donors and dedicated staff for their work, commitment and passion. Together we are improving lives locally and for that, I thank you.







Community Impact Initiatives

Be A Leader Be A Hero

Empowering thousands of elementary school students to make a difference in the lives of others through acts of kindness and good deeds on the playground and in the classroom.

Community Action Group on Homelessness (CAGH)

UW is part of the leadership team of the CAGH, a joint community program of nonprofit organizations, government representatives and community leaders who are working together to end homelessness in Fredericton.

Community Food Smart (CFS)

UW is a founding partner of CFS, a bulk food buying club for individuals and families wishing to purchase quality produce at affordable prices. Our goal is to help community members stretch their food dollar by offering monthly access to quality produce at affordable prices.

Day of Caring

Mobilizing teams of corporate and government employees as volunteers to complete meaningful, hands-on projects that will greatly assist local non-profit agencies.

FEELS GOOD Folly Fest

Like Feels Good, we too believe in creating opportunities for children to engage in arts and music. As such, we host the UW Kids Zone at Folly Fest where we work with the Feels Good team to deliver music and arts related activities for children and youth.

NB Food Security Action Network

United Way participates on the NBFSAN leadership team and provides administrative support and office space for the network.

Renaissance College Community Problem Solving

Each year we work with talented 3rd year RC students. In 2014, students built upon the Vital Signs report and dove deeper into community data to develop a report that will guide UW as we assess and work to improve our funding model.

OHS Student Impact Committee

In 2013, Cassandra Boulanger was a Grade 12 student at Oromocto High School (OHS). Cassandra always knew she wanted to make some kind of difference in her community, but like many high school students she wasn't entirely sure how to gain the skills she was so desperately looking for.

Cassandra was approached by her guidance counselor, Lynn Thomas-Grattan about an opportunity to get involved in her community of Oromocto, through a program at her high school. The program was called *Student Impact Committee* and it was facilitated and funded through the United Way of Central New Brunswick.

"I wasn't totally sure what I was signing up for at first. But Mrs. Thomas-Grattan explained the United Way to me and I knew it was an organization I wanted to get involved with," Cassandra explained. "I learned about working in a team, having meaningful conversations and most importantly, critical thinking skills. I was able to learn, in fact we all were, how important it is to think critically about where money is going. It was really important that the money we provided our community with was going to sustainable causes, and in order to ensure that we had to look at every application from all sides."

Cassandra saw direct impact in her own school when the committee approved funding for the OHS Breakfast for Learning program, among others. "It was pretty neat knowing I really made that impact. Students were eating breakfast in my own school, in small part, thanks to the Student Impact Committee."



Cassandra explained that the skills she learned during her time with the Student Impact Committee were crucial to her learning and her ability to be a successful post-secondary student. Soon after, she was accepted to the University of New Brunswick's Renaissance College, Canada's premiere leadership program that accepts only 25 outstanding students per year.

Today, Cassandra has completed her first year at Renaissance College and won a travel study scholarship to study in France. She has been named the Duke of Edinburgh's Duke Delegate for the province of New Brunswick, and is currently completing an internship with the Duke of Edinburgh in Fredericton, New Brunswick. She is looking towards a science related career, hopefully revolving around animal and environmental welfare.

Cassandra is quick to credit much of her success to the experiences she had with the United Way of Central New Brunswick's Student Impact Committee, "You just don't get to gain those skills in high school anywhere else! All high school students should get the opportunity to make real change, the way I got to with SIC."

"The best part is definitely the confidence I gained through the program, like I said- you just don't get that anywhere else."
