One in four people require a United Way Central N.B. service in our community. Every day, United Way and agencies we have supported are helping our family members, neighbours, co-workers and friends. Our community once again recognized this need and demonstrated its generosity contributing over \$1.3 million to our annual campaign. A special 'thank you' to our new campaign chair Laura O'Blenis, Director of Resource Development Anne Foster and the entire United Way team for motivating our community to achieve these results.

In addition to the positive campaign result, our Community Impact Agenda is making great strides. It has been another busy year fo the Board. The Finance Committee drafted and finalized a new purchasing policy. The Strategic Planning committee completed an update of the strategic plan. 



Songs of the City

A partnership with Shivering Songs & TNB, SOC told transformative stories of people whose lives have been changed by the generosity of our community. Those individuals were paired with TNB to develop their stories which were then interpreted by Canadian musicians and presented at The Playhouse.

Timeraiser

A volunteer matching fair, silent art auction, and night on the town for UW. Participants bid volunteer hours on artwork, non-profits find skilled volunteers, and young professionals find meaningful volunteer opportunities. Winwin-win!

Real Stories. Real Change. Jermaine and Dria

Jermaine is 17 years old and just recently finished high school. He has been with Big Brothers/Big Sisters Fredericton for 11 years. Jermaine was matched with a big sister, Dria at 6 years old. When Dria applied to be a Big Sister, she assumed that she would be matched with a girl. However, their wonderful BBBS caseworker explained there's a huge need for Big Brothers, so when a boy, parent, and Big agree, a Little Brother can be paired with a Big Sister, and here we are 11 years later reading their story.

"I can still remember the first little outing we went on. It was just a simple drive to Tim Hortons. When we got there, Dria asked what I wanted to get. I had said that I wanted an ice cappuccino. Dria, however, didn't know if my parents actually let me drink them and didn't want to send me home loaded on caffeine on a school night so I had to settle for something else. I'm not entirely sure of what I thought at the time, but I was probably a bit disappointed – first time meeting this lady and she didn't let me have what I wanted. It's safe to say that I've forgiven her since then," Jermaine explained of his first Big Brothers Big Sisters experience.

Being with Big Brothers/Big Sisters all these years has been a fantastic experience for Jermaine, as a "little". He says he has experienced a plethora of things he probably would never have done if he was not with Big Brothers/Big Sisters. Jermaine and Dria have had many fun adventures, like summer trips to New River Beach for the sand castle competition, making pizza, baking cookies, playing mini golf, sea kayaking in Fundy and volunteering together for BBBS and other organizations. Jermaine even taught his big sister to play chess when he took it up in grade 5.



But, Dria explained that her favorite memories revolve simply around her conversations with her Little Brother, "Jermaine inspires me. He's positive, thoughtful, hard-working and courageous. It's been a privilege to watch him grow from a shy 6 year old into an adult with a powerful, quiet confidence. Seeing him walk across the stage to receive his well-earned grade 12 diploma recently was amazing and I am forever grateful to the dedicated BBBS team for matching us. Jermaine is an extraordinary soul and I'm blessed to have him in my life."

Jermaine and Dria have had an amazing journey together through the Big Brothers Big Sisters program however; their success doesn't stop with great memories and a strong friendship. It's thanks to Big Brothers/ Big Sisters that Jermaine was awarded the CIBC Youthvision Scholarship, a scholarship valued at \$36,000. It includes summer employment for his high school and post-secondary years, \$4000 in tuition each year for four years, and Jermaine was flown to Toronto to accept the scholarship and celebrate with the other recipients.
