

# **INVESTING FOR LOCAL IMPACT**

As a collective impact organization, United Way Central New Brunswick believes it is critical to be leaders in evidence-based community investment for lasting social change and impact.

With complex challenges facing our communities, it is imperative that we ensure our collective efforts and resources are being invested strategically to create the greatest and most needed impact. For this reason, all programs funded by our United Way undergo vigorous assessment and monitoring processes to ensure that our collective efforts are invested in programs that have the greatest impact on improving local lives.

We know it is important to make well-informed and strategic investments in programs and initiatives that are proven to be urgently needed AND deeply effective. We are proud to report that last year, 85% of programs powered by your United Way contributions reached or exceeded their targets. For example, 89% of participating children from one of our high-needs neighborhoods reached or exceeded their educational goals during their program. That is real social impact.

We work hard to make smart investments in programs that address root causes and make real long-term change. Last year, our United Way supported Housing First services aimed at ending the cycle of homelessness for people who had been chronically homeless. Our contribution of \$25,000 in this program was leveraged to provide services that reduce people's need for emergency/short-term services (i.e., hospitals, ambulances, and policing) by providing them with the supports needed to access and maintain safe, affordable housing. This sort of upstream approach saved taxpayers approximately \$550,000 AND saved lives.

Our annual Impact Report is meant to show how contributions from community (i.e., skills, time and funds) do make an important difference. No one person or organization can tackle or solve these complex challenges alone; however, together, we create an impressive collective impact.

Congratulations and thank you to our donors, partners and stakeholders for their collaborative efforts to change lives and improve our community for all people.




